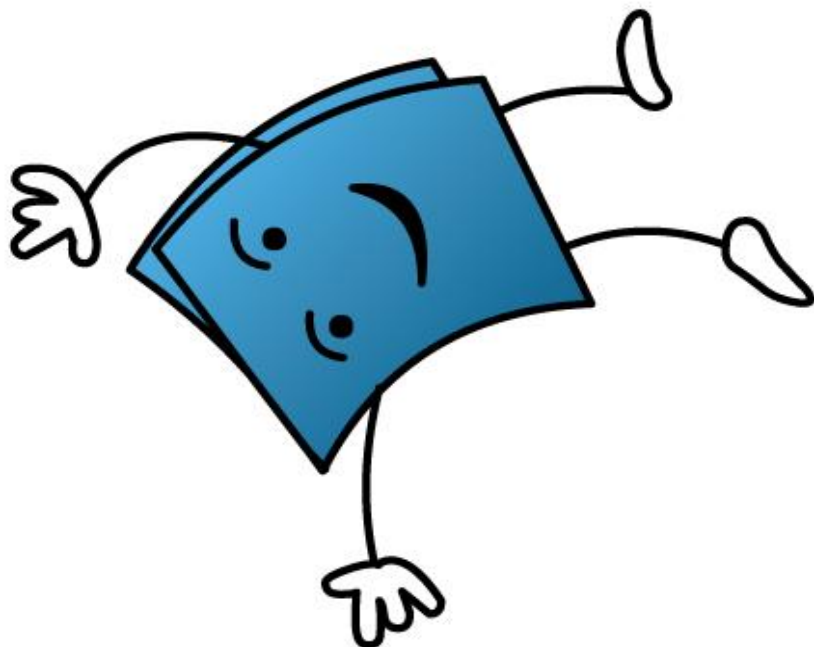

# What is Tumblebooks?

TumbleBooks is an e-media database with books and other media for all ages!

What sets TumbleBooks apart is its interactivity. Narration, animation, and more make the experience come alive for you and your child(ren).

## Offerings

- **Read-alongs:** narrated chapter books with highlighted text so kids can follow along.
- **Story books** (fiction and non-fiction; available in English, Spanish, and French): animated and professionally narrated picture books, with highlighted text so children can follow along.
- **Ebooks** (fiction and non-fiction)
- **Graphic novels**
- **National Geographic videos**
- **Puzzles and games**

## How to access TumbleBooks

### How to access TumbleBooks

1. Go to the library's website  
[www.lincolnwoodlibrary.org](http://www.lincolnwoodlibrary.org)
2. Hover over **Resources**. Select **Quick Links**.
3. Select **TumbleBooks**.
4. If you are an SD74 teacher, use the alternate TumbleBooks link.


# Searching the TumbleBooks Database

TumbleBooks has a search feature with many different options to suit your needs. Click on “TumbleSearch” in the upper right corner of the page to launch the search menu.

- If you already know what book you’re looking for, you can use the ‘search by title’ or ‘search by author’ feature.
- If you’re looking for books and media on a particular topic, you can use the ‘search by subject’ option.
- If you’re planning a lesson and want content of a specific length, you can use the “search by TumbleTime” feature.

You can even search by Lexile or AR level. *Just remember that reading levels are only one part of the picture when choosing the perfect book for a child.*

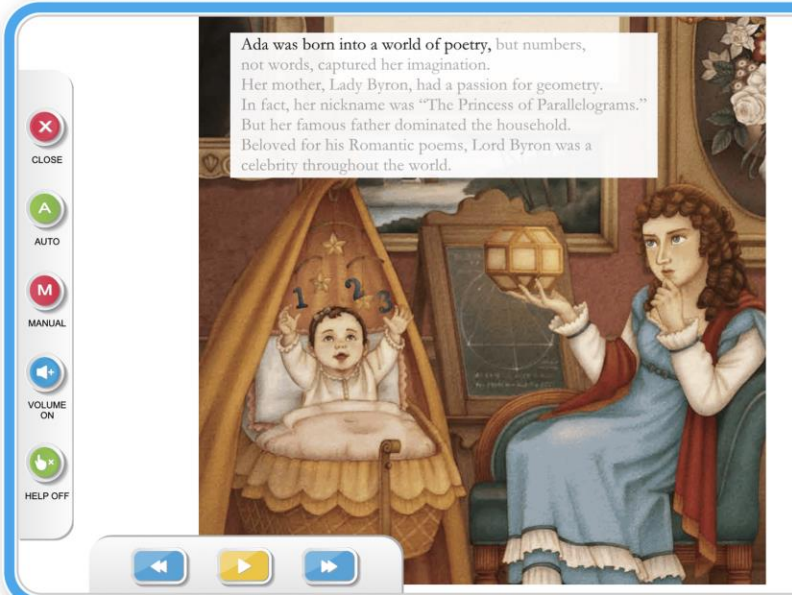

Once you've chosen a book and/or video to enjoy together, there are many options for engaging with the content. Look to the left-hand side menu and:

- Click on "**Play Video**" to watch the video selected or the animated/narrated version of the book selected.
- Click on "**Quizzes**" to gauge comprehension after reading/viewing.
- Click on "**Lesson Plans**" to view lesson plan ideas and pre-made, printable activity sheets.
- Click on "**Book Report**" to launch an interactive book report creator with open-ended question prompts (at two age levels: grades K-3 and grade 4+) to spark critical thinking about the book/media.

*Note: Depending on the book/media you've selected you may have only some of these options available to you.*

# Playing a read-along e-book



When you launch a read-along e-book (fiction or non-fiction), you will see a set of controls on the left-hand side and bottom of your screen.

- Click on **"Auto"** to have the pages turn automatically when narration is complete and have sentences/words highlighted as they are narrated.
  - In this mode, you can also pause the video (the yellow play/pause button at the bottom of the screen) to stop and discuss.
- Click on **"Manual"** to turn the pages at back and forth at your own pace.
- Click on **"Volume On/Off"** to turn on or off the narration feature.
  - Independent readers may want to watch the video without narration so they can read the text aloud themselves!

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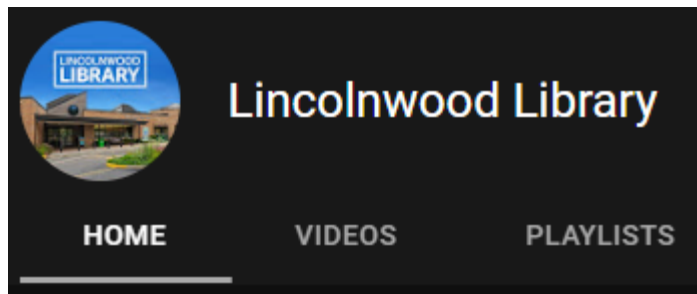

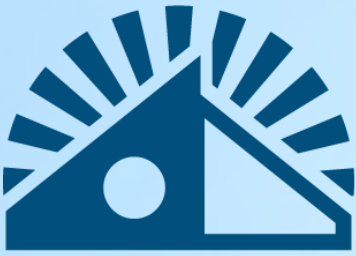
## **Help your little one blossom into a budding reader!**
