
How to access Tutor.com


What next?




Connecting with a tutor

- Click on the Topic box and select the topic you want help with.
- Click on the Subject box to select a specific subject within the topic.
- Click on the Grade box to select the grade level of the subject.
- If desired, click on the box under Grade to request a tutor who can instruct by voice chat.
- Enter your question in the box marked Enter Your Question. If you need to include a diagram or other visual help, click on Attach a File below and choose the file from your hard drive, flash drive, etc.
- Click the CONNECT NOW button.

Submitting documents for review

Tutor.com has a staff of tutors who can check your essay, résumé, or cover letter for factual errors, grammar, and other issues that could impact the effectiveness of your document.




- Under What kind of help do you need? box, select WriteTutor Essay or Job Help.
- Select your grade level if applicable.
- Explain the topic of your paper.
- Select from the Where are you in the writing process box, followed by selecting any boxes you want the tutor to focus on.

- Describe your assignment, including instructions from your teacher.
- If your teacher requires a citation format, select one from the box.
- Upload the document for review, then click **Submit.**

Dropping off a math question

Mathematics can be difficult sometimes, and as exams near, a live tutor session for more complex questions may take up too much time. In addition to live tutoring, one can send a question to a tutor, who will send feedback within 24 hours.



- Under the What help do you need? box, select a topic.
- Select your grade level.
- Type your question in the box.
- If required, attach a file by clicking the link. Alternatively, you can click on Draw your problem to illustrate the problem.
- Click the Submit box.


Tutor.com offers practice testing for high school and college students. These tests include practice tests, score reports, and even timing accommodations.
